Class: The wow factor – pastels unleashed!

Tutor: Lyn Diefenbach We provide this list of materials as a guide only for you to bring to the workshop. Your Tutor has compiled this list so you can embrace the class and skills being taught.

Please bring the following:

Florals:

NB for florals: Please come with your composition already drawn up in a PALE pastel pencil or a colour pertinent to your bloom. Focus your composition more on one or two blooms so that it is more of a portrait of a flower.

Paper: 1 sheet (18 x 24") of UART 600 or white Ampersand Pastelbord (these

are available from softpastels.com.au) or Fisher 400 paper (available through Amazon.com.au). I suggest, with regards to size, to use no smaller than a half sheet. You may use the full sheet if you wish.

Pastels: bring what you have. Include colours suitable to your subject.

Backing Board: Not required for Ampersand Pastelbord

For UART 600 and Fisher 400 put another sheet beneath the one you

are working on, especially if your backing board is foam core.

- 1/4" Angle Brush this is to brush away unwanted pastel.
- Bulldog Clips
- Easel
- Paper towels
- Kneadable eraser
- Drop Sheet

Reference Photos

make sure these are large, clear images preferably with a good play of light and dark. If you are doing your own printing from a computer, make sure that you use photo quality paper NOT plain paper.

Portrait:

NB please DO NOT pre-draw your portrait as the drawing and achieving a good likeness is a significant part of the workshop.

Paper - 16 x 20" is a good size to work with

1 x sheet Canson MITIENTES. Colour examples: Flannel Grey, Oyster, Sand, Bisque, Eggshell. Orange or Tobacco for darker skin. Any greyed-off colour works.

Or you may use Art Spectrum Colorfix, Art Spectrum Smooth, UART 600, PastelMat or any of the other sanded papers if you prefer.

Pastels - Bring what you have. Girault and Rembrandt have got some

particularly good portrait colours.

Backing Board - have at least 4 sheets of other pastel paper to pad the board if using Mi-Tientes. If using a sanded paper, you will only need one other sheet as backing

- 1/4" Angle Shader Brush NEEF 995 this is to brush away unwanted pastel.
- Willow Charcoal
- Bulldog Clips
- Tissues
- Easel
- Paper towels
- Kneadable eraser
- Drop Sheet

Subject photos make sure these are large, clear images preferably with a good play of

light and dark. If you are doing your own printing from a computer,

make sure that you use photo quality paper **NOT** plain paper.

Approximate material cost - \$250 depending on what the student already has.

Daily Schedule:

DAY ONE

Florals in Pastel

- Introduction on composition and application
- Demonstration by tutor. Demonstrations will continue throughout the 7 days
- Students starting their own work

DAY TWO

 Students continue working on their painting with plenty of individual easel time from the tutor

DAY THREE

- Completion of the floral
- An overall critique session

NB the floral component may continue into the first half of day 4 depending on progress

DAY FOUR

(Morning may complete floral component)

Portraits in Pastel

- Introduction to drawing the portrait and how to gain a good likeness
- Tutor Demonstration
- Students begin their drawing

DAY FIVE

- Students complete their drawing
- Introduction to pastel application and value/colour use in the portrait
- Tutor demonstration
- Students continue working

DAY SIX

• Students continue on their portrait with plenty of easel time from the tutor

DAY SEVEN

- Finishing the portrait
- An overall critique session
