**Please bring the following:**

- **1 x Upholstered furniture piece**
  - Suitability of the furniture piece must be discussed with Lasse and Helena prior to registration. Example of a suitable piece is a timber framed chair with upholstered seat and back. Can be a dining chair, occasional chair or small armchair.
- **Tools:**
  - Small upholstery hammer, staple lifter, webbing stretcher, mallet, scissors, tape measure.
  - Helena and Lasse can either sell these to the student or advise the student on what to purchase
- PPE: paper dust mask with valve, disposable rubber gloves
- Camera
- Notebook and pencil for notetaking
- Appropriate upholstery materials for their furniture item (can be purchased from tutors)
  - These will be discussed with each student prior to registration.

**Approximate material cost:**

- \$50 - \$150 plus fabric is the estimated material cost.
- Cost of materials will depend on the furniture item - the tutor will provide estimate of costs to each student upon enrolment after discussion with student about their piece selection.
