BYO - The following items are not included in your registration. Please bring the following with you:

BRUSHES:

- ROYMAC Future Brush Round (made in India) sizes 2-10 available from Artshed, West End or most Officeworks shops. I suggest two of each size. Prices range from \$4 to \$7 per brush.
- MONTMARTRE small brushes (yellow handle size 4) for detailed work. Available from Artshed, West End.
- Selection of pallet knives small to medium.

PAINTS:

- I suggest middle range acrylics (not too expensive, but also not cheap). I prefer heavy bodied paint. I suggest Dimensions Premium /Atelier heavy body/Matisse /aliquoted heavy body.
- I do not suggest 'flow' paints. They will be too thin.
- Except for white and black, I suggest either 100 ml tubes (about \$10) or the 250 ml tubs (approximately \$17 Artshed).
- 500ml or 250ml tub of titanium white (we will use a lot of white).
- 250 or 500ml tub black Gesso (we will use the gesso for undercoating.

General paints: 100 or 250ml quantities

- Medium yellow
- Cadmium red
- Azo vermillion
- Orange
- Monastral Green
- Sap green.
- Hookers green.
- Yellow ochre
- Purple
- Magenta
- Turquoise blue
- Cerulean blue
- Pthalo blue
- Ultramarine blue

CANVASES OR BOARDS OR CARDBOARD

 I am happy for you to use any of these surfaces. I suggest the small size should be 40 x 50 cm in the largest 60 x 90 cm. There are some great canvases available at Kmart which come complete with floater frames. These can be obtained in assorted sizes, but the size I would recommend would be 40 x 50 cm. They cost \$15 each. I expect we will be painting 1-3 canvases per day. For the life study (on Thursday morning), I suggest you bring cardboard or old canvases.

- Container for water
